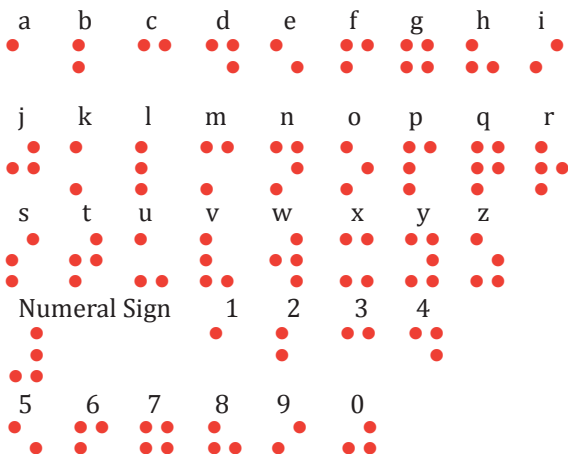

Braille Alphabet and Numbers



The six dots of the Braille cell are arranged and numbered
1 ● ● 4
thus: 2 ● ● 5 The capital sign, dot 6, placed before a letter,
3 ● ● 6
makes it a capital. The numeral sign, dots 3, 4, 5, 6, placed
before a character, makes it a number and not a letter.
Braille punctuation marks are formed by using dots in the
lower part of the cell.

Braille Art incorporates a picture with words written in text and Braille. Our art is a collection of original photos and paintings chosen for the relation to the words intended for a particular piece. The final part of the composition is the Braille overlay that provides a long lasting copy of Braille and gives added emotional depth to the piece.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is Braille?

A: The Braille system is a method that is widely used by blind people to read and write. Louis Braille, a Frenchman, devised Braille in 1821. Each Braille character or cell is made up of six dot positions arranged in a rectangle containing two columns of three dots each.

Q: How is Braille made?

A: Braille transcription involves taking a piece of printed material and rendering the content in the tactile writing and reading system named after its inventor Louis Braille.
